The materials were arranged by the donor. Manuscripts and Archives created the collection level description and biographical information.

Biographical / Historical

Arthur Bostwick Van Buskirk was born on March 27, 1896 in Pottstown, Pennsylvania. He graduated from Yale College in 1918 before attending the University of Pennsylvania Law School. Van Buskirk served as vice-president of T. Mellon & Sons and vice chairman of the Urban Redevelopmenet Authority of Pittsburgh, the city's post-World War II urban renewal program. His sons, George, Joseph, and David, all graduated from Yale University.

Arthur Van Buskirk served as a member of the Yale Expeditionary Force and was commissioned as a Second Lieutanant in the Field Artillery Section of the Officers Reserve Corps in August 1917. He joined the support efforts on the Western Front, arriving in France in July 1918.

Van Buskirk died on April 6, 1972 in Ligonier, Pennsylvania.

Biographical information in this note is primarily drawn from Wilmarth Sheldon Lewis, *History of the Class of 1918, Yale College, Forty Years On*, (New Haven: Yale University Press,1954), 334-337, and the Obituary of Arthur Van Botswick, *New York Times*, April 7, 1972.

Scope and Contents

Collection consists of two diaries by Arthur Botswick Van Buskirk documenting his military experience during World War I. Newspaper clippings, correspondence, tickets, and other ephemera were originally inserted between diary pages. Several pages in volume II detail the Armistice of November 11, 1918 in Paris, France.

Materials that have been removed from the diaries have been sleeved and labeled to indicate their original location, when known.
