McComb, Katherine Anne Porter, and others. The correspondence includes approximately 850 letters from Poore to his parents, much of which dates from Poore's days as a student and his service in the Army Ambulance Corps and Red Cross during World War One. Notebooks and diaries contain journal entries, drafts of literary projects and correspondence, travel logs, and student notebooks, as well as diaries Poore kept while serving in Europe during the war. The collection also contains drafts of writings, family and personal photographs, and other papers.

Dudley Poore (1893-1981)

Dudley Poore, American author and translator, was the son of Alvin B. and Mary L. Poore. He was educated at Harvard University prior to the First World War and, during the war, served in the Army Ambulance Corps and Red Cross. Poetry by Poore is included in *Eight Harvard Poets* (1917) and his translations of Spanish and Portuguese works include *Our Daily Bread* (1943) by Enrique Gil Gilbert and *The Bonfire* (1944) by Cecilio J. Carneiro. Poore also co-edited the selections *Fiesta in November: Stories from Latin America* (1942) and *Cuentistas norteamericanos* (1946).

Scope and Contents

The papers contain correspondence, notebooks and diaries, writings, photographs, and other materials documenting the personal and professional life of American poet and author Dudley Poore. Poore was part of a circle of writers at Harvard University before WWI that included e.e. cummings, John Dos Passos, Robert Hillyer, Robert Stewart Mitchell, and Cuthbert Wright, published together in *Eight Harvard Poets* (1917), and the correspondence features letters with these associates, as well as John Peale Bishop, Dudley

Collection Contents

Series I: Correspondence, 1910-1975

Series I. Correspondence features correspondence with authors, publishers, and Poore's family. Poore was part of a small circle of writers at Harvard University before WWI, including e.e. cummings, John Dos Passos, Robert Hillyer, Robert Stewart Mitchell, and Cuthbert Wright, published together in *Eight Harvard Poets* (1917). General Correspondence features letters from these Harvard associates, as well as John Peale Bishop, Dudley Fitts, Robert Finch, Arthur K. McComb, Katherine Anne Porter, and others.

General Correspondence includes some third-party correspondence. Unsorted correspondence is listed at the end of the alphabetical run of named correspondents.

Family correspondence features approximately 850 pieces of correspondence from Poore to his parents, Alvin and Mary Poore, much of which dates from Poore's days as a student at Harvard and his service in the Army Ambulance Corps and Red Cross during the war.
