SUMMARY: The collection consists of client files and biographical material related to Herbert Matter. The client files provide examples of Matter's logo, advertisement, and publication designs for several well known businesses, including Knoll, Inc., Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum, and the New Haven Railroad. The biographical material contains both works created by Matter, such as promotional material and photographs, as well as works about Matter, such as published articles and papers related to his teaching career at Yale. The majority of materials in this collection were amassed in support of a retrospective exhibition which took place at the Yale University Art and Architecture Gallery from January 16 to February 3, 1978.

Biographical / Historical

Herbert Matter was born in Engelberg, Switzerland, on April 25, 1907. He was encouraged by his family to pursue his artistic interests, which were apparent early in his life. The Matter family owned a dance hall and restaurant where they hung Matter's early paintings.

In the late 1920s Matter moved to Paris to be a part of the active art scene there. He studied with the painters Fernand Léger and Amédée Ozenfant. He also assisted the graphic designer Adolphe Cassandre and the architect Le Corbusier. During his time in Paris, Matter started to move away from painting toward the graphic arts, especially photography, and he became a master of photomontage. Matter used this technique to great effect in several travel posters created between 1932 and 1936 for the Swiss National Tourist Office. This work established his reputation as a prominent and successful graphic designer.

Matter moved to New York City in 1936. He worked as photographer and designer for such magazines as *Harper's Bazaar* and *Vogue* and for lesser known, but more cutting edge, publications like *New Pencil Points*. He also designed publications for the Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum and the Museum of Fine Arts in Houston, Texas, as well as logos, publications, and advertising materials for many companies, most notably the New Haven Railroad and Knoll, Inc.

In 1952 Matter joined the faculty of the graphic design and photography programs at Yale University, where he taught until 1976. Matter was also involved with the New York Studio School, which his wife founded. As the Yale graduate program produced many successful designers, Matter's ideas became widespread in the graphic design world. Students remember Matter fondly and were greatly influenced by his teachings.

Matter died in Southampton, New York, on May 8, 1984.

Scope and Contents

The Yale Collection of Herbert Matter contains materials that trace the personal and professional aspects of the life of an important graphic designer. The collection will be of interest to those studying the design career of Matter, the history of advertising or logos for the companies represented (especially Knoll, Inc.), the publications of the Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum, and to some extent, the life history of Matter.

The collection primarily focuses on Matter's work with clients, especially the magazine ads and promotional material he designed for Knoll between 1946 and 1966 and the publications he designed for the Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum from 1959 to 1967. The biographical material includes both copies of his Paris diaries from 1928 to 1932 and copies of notes on an exhibition about Matter which took place in 1989. Other notable items in the collection are photograms created in a Yale class, and some photographs taken by Matter studying the value contrasts of tree bark. The majority of materials in this collection were amassed in support of a retrospective exhibition which took place at the Yale University Art and Architecture Gallery from January 16 to February 3, 1978.

Arranged in two series: I. Client Files, 1932-1974. II. Biographical Material, 1928-1991.

Collection Contents

Series I: Client Files, 1932-1974

The series contains examples of design work produced by Matter, and is arranged alphabetically by client. Materials include photography, magazine advertisements, promotional material, publication design, and more. When the work that Matter produced for the client is merely a logo (as with the Boston and Maine or New Haven Railroads) the materials in these files are not necessarily produced by Matter, but do document the use of his logo designs. If Matter worked as a designer for a client, a publication from that client may be included, even if Matter's individual work is not specifically identified within the publication. Additionally, the Knoll file contains a selection of copper plates (color separated) that were used to print the advertisements Matter designed.
