Biographical / Historical

Samuel B. Reed (1818-1891): engineer on the Erie Canal enlargement in the 1840s; then moved west to Ohio, Illinois, and Iowa while working on various railroads.

Scope and Contents

The collection consists of correspondence and papers dated 1840-1921 relating to the personal life and business affairs of Samuel B. Reed (1818-1921) and his family. Reed was a civil engineer who surveyed and supervised the construction of many important railroad lines in the western United States and Canada in the mid-nineteenth century. Letters to his wife, Mrs. Jane Ann (Earl) Reed (1827-1896), often contain lengthy descriptions of the problems involved in railway building in its pioneer stages. The railroads with which Reed was associated were the Michigan Central, Mississippi and Missouri, Chicago and Rock Island, Burlington and Missouri River, Union Pacific, Southern Railroad Association, Illinois Central, Chicago, Pekin and South-Western, and the Canadian Pacific Railway. Among Reed's business correspondence there are a number of letters with various railroad executives involved in railway building. Of particular importance is the correspondence with Henry Farnam (1803-1883) builder of the Chicago and Rock Island Railroad, which deals with Reed's part in the construction of the first bridge over the Mississippi.

Among the large amount of personal correspondence to Mrs. Reed are letters from Lucy Adeline (Hurd) Van Horne, wife of Sir William Cornelius Van Horne, builder of the Canadian Pacific Railway. Mrs. Van Horne was a daughter of Erastus Hurd, an uncle of Samuel B. Reed. Her letters give information regarding the personal life of Sir William Van Horne.
