Biographical / Historical

Hervey DeLoss Leland, B.A. 1885.

Born March 6, 1862, in Elkhorn, Wis.; Died October 6, 1941, in Brooklyn, N.Y.

Father, George Washington Leland, forwarding agent for the Erie Canal, Utica, N.Y. Mother, Harriet (Wright) Leland.

Utica Free Academy. Second colloquy appointment Junior and Senior years.

Attended Union Theological Seminary 1885-88 (diploma 1888); ordained minister of Reformed Church in America, Utica, 1888; minister Dutch Reformed Church, Owasco Outlet, N.Y., and attended Auburn Theological Seminary 1888-89; English teacher in government school Hikone, Japan, 1889-91 and Osaka 1891-92; minister Presbyterian church Smithfield, N.Y., 1892-97, Niagara Falls, N.Y., 1897-98, and Howard, Kans., 1899-1900; teacher of English government school Iwakuni, Japan, 1901-11, Imperial Naval College, Etajima, 1911-12, Kofu 1914-15, and Nagoya 1915-16; attended Protestant Episcopal Theological Seminary, Alexandria, Va., 1916-17; ordained deacon in Episcopal church 1917; minister Clifton Forge, Va., 1917 and Eastport, Maine, 1918; taught mathematics and Greek Virginia Episcopal School, Lynchburg, Va., September-December, 1918; curate St. Paul's Church, Stockbridge and South Lee, Mass., 1919-20; supply minister Wesleyville, Pa., 1920-21, Waddington, N.Y., 1921, and DeKalb Junction 1921-22; attended Harvard Divinity School 1922-23, Bangor Theological Seminary 1923-24, and Episcopal Theological School, Cambridge, Mass., 1925-26; during these years supplied various churches in New York, Pennsylvania, and Maine; resided at Auburn Theological Seminary 1926-36 and in Brooklyn 1936-41.

Unmarried.

Death due to general debility caused by old age. Buried in Evergreen Cemetery, Brooklyn. Survived by no immediate relatives.

Scope and Contents

This small collection contains a number of items belonging to Hervey DeLoss Leland, including several relating to his life in Japan. Among these are a letter of thanks from Zenzo Yabe; Leland's diary of 1909 written while he was teaching in Iwakuni, Japan; a possible pay envelope written in Japanese; and a photograph possibly of Yamaguchi Chu-gak-ko (Middle School). Papers not directly concerned with Japan

include a notebook on topics of religion, theology, Koranic and Biblical studies, and ten certificates and diplomas.

These papers were the gift of James R. Joy in 1942.
