Processing Information

This collection consists of materials formerly classed as Ms Vault Taylor, Ms Vault 9:1, Z117 0201, Z117 201, Z117 202 1, Z117 202 2, Z117 202 3, Z117 203, Z117 204, Z117 205, Z117 206, Z117 207, and Z117 208. Some of these materials were included in the microfilm edition of the Ezra Stiles Papers and are indexed in *A Guide to the Microfilm Edition of the Ezra Stiles Papers at Yale University*, edited by Harold E. Selesky (New Haven: Yale University Library, 1978). Before processing in 2018, readers were generally required to access these materials via the microfilm, and each microfilm frame included a notice requiring permission of the Yale University Library for reproduction or publication. Prior to microfilming, some volumes were disbound, and manuscript fragments removed from bindings were housed separately. Some contents of the collection were treated by conservators during custody by Yale or possibly by former owners, including silking of fragile paper.

In 2018, the collection was reclassified under one call number and organized in two series. Index cards used as microfilm targets were discarded. A fragile volume titled "China's description and commonplace book" was disbound and treated by conservators, and its binding was rehoused separately. Other fragile and silked items were referred to conservators for evaluation and treatment. Other than restricted access to fragile materials, all access, reproduction, and publication restrictions were lifted.

Edward Taylor (1642-1729) (Harvard 1671)

Edward Taylor (1642-1729) (Harvard 1671), Congregational clergyman and poet. Taylor was minister of the First Congregational Church (Westfield, Mass.), 1671-1729. He married Ruth Wyllys (1670-1730) in 1692; their daughter Kezia Taylor Stiles (1702-1727) married Isaac Stiles (1697-1760) (Yale 1722), minister in North Haven, Connecticut, and their son Ezra Stiles (1727-1795) (Yale 1746), was minister of the Second Congregational Church, Newport, Rhode Island, 1755-1776, and president of Yale College, 1777-1795.
