After the trial, Dartmouth is put in custody of the Sergeant at Arms, although he protests that "I had rather stay, tho I were sure to dye in England, than go to live in France" (p.733). In the end, Dartmouth fails to prove his innocence, and is sent to the Tower (p.739). His last letter, written to Lord Sydney [Henry Sidney, earl of Romney (1641-1704)] states that "to find myself thus stigmatized as a Traytor to my Country, and that in the behalfe of France, is the greivousest burthen can possibly be lay'd upon me."
