## **Biographical / Historical**

Philip Dodson Sprouse was born in 1906 in Tennessee. He graduated from Washington and Lee University in 1928. Sprouse became a Foreign Service officer in 1938 and served in China. In the 1940s he served as an advisor on China to the Harry Truman presidential administration, traveling to China on diplomatic missions with General George C. Marshall and General Albert C. Wedemeyer. In 1959 he was appointed a Foreign Service Inspector and later served as the United States Ambassador to Cambodia from 1962 to 1964. Sprouse retired in 1964 and died in San Francisco, California in 1977.

#### **Content Description**

The collection consists of correspondence related to United States Ambassador Philip Dodson Sprouse, including letters from former Secretary of State Dean Acheson and General George C. Marshall. Also includes letters from diplomatic colleagues and family, reactions to Sprouse's death, photographs of Sprouse, and research and biographical material relating to Sprouse compiled by Ravi D. Goel.

#### Arrangement

The materials are arranged in five groupings: Incoming correspondence; Outgoing correspondence; Third party correspondence; Photographs; and Research material. Materials within these groups are arranged in the order in which they were received from the donor by Manuscripts and Archives.
