Contents include: a full leaf from a French bible, possibly produced in Liessies circa 1250, with five decorated initials; a calendar leaf from a book of hours by the Dunois Master;

6 leaves, five with initials, from the Bohun Bible; and many leaves containing historiated initials from bibles, books of hours and service books, mostly

French or Italian.

James Stevens-Cox (1900-1997)

James Stevens-Cox (1900-1997) was the son of a wigmaker and hairdresser. Educated at Bristol Grammar School, he left at 16 to join the family business. Around 1930, he purchased the 75,000 volume stock of a second-hand book dealer in Bristol and opened the Coleridge Bookshop, which he developed into a major antiquarian bookstore. Stevens-Cox also authored several volumes of local history and archaeology, collected early manuscripts and fragments, and kept bees and birds. He died in 1997.

Content Description

The James Stevens-Cox Collection of Manuscript Leaves and Fragments consists of 45 items, some full individual leaves and others cuttings of illuminated initials or decorative elements, dating from between approximately 1250 and approximately 1525. Contents include: a full leaf from a French bible, possibly produced in Liessies circa 1250, with five decorated initials; a calendar leaf from a book of hours by the Dunois Master; 6 leaves, five with initials, from the Bohun Bible; and many leaves containing historiated initials from bibles, books of hours and service books, mostly French or Italian.
