David Grant Noble (born 1939) is an American photographer and writer whose focus is the history and archaeology of the American Southwest.

Scope and Contents

The David Grant Noble photographs and papers document Noble's work as a photographer and writer. Photographs consist of black and white prints, color prints, platinum prints, contact sheets, proofs, negatives, slides, transparencies, and related papers. Subjects include landscapes of the American Southwest, Vietnam, New York City, Taos Pueblo, cars, portraits, China, the Yucatán, Ecuador, and others. Papers consist of lectures, publications, professional correspondence, unpublished writings, journals, and publicity and reviews.

Organized into two series: I. Photographs, circa 1940s-2017. II. Papers, 1950-2017.
