Biographical / Historical

Jonathan Knight (1789-1864) (Yale 1808, M.D. 1818) was appointed Professor of Anatomy and Physiology following the organization of the Medical Institution of Yale College in 1813. He was in the post for 25 years before being transferred to the Chair of Surgery. He resigned from Yale in 1864 May.

Throughout his residence in New Haven, Connecticut, Knight engaged in medical practice. From 1846 to 1847, he was President of the Convention which formed the American Medical Association--in 1853, he was President of the Association. At the time of his death in 1864 August, Knight was President of the American Mutual Life Insurance Company.
