# **Scope and Contents**

The collection contains glass plate and photographic negatives of scenes from World War I in France by Reverend George Fountain, including images of Sergeant Alvin York and General John J. Pershing, lantern slides of scenes from silent films by an unknown photographer, and motion picture films related to the Bible and physician Edward Livingston Trudeau and the Saranac Laboratory for the Study of Tuberculosis. Also included is a stereopticon used to project images from the lantern slides, which feature actors such as Marion Davies and Douglas Fairbanks, onto a movie screen.

### Arrangement

Organized into three series. I. George Fountain Glass Plate and Photographic Negatives of World War I, 1919, 1978. II. Lantern Slides Related to Silent Film and Stereopticon, circa 1910s-1920s. III. Motion Picture Films, circa 1910s-1920s.

#### **Collection Contents**

# Series I: George Fountain Glass Plate and Photographic Negatives of World War I, 1919, 1978

7.59 linear feet (11 boxes)

Rev. George Fountain was a pastor who most likely traveled to France with the Young Men's Christian Association to minister and provide medical aid to soldiers during World War I. During his service, he photographed various battle sites and towns, monuments, soldiers, and military aircraft, vehicles, and arms.

This series contains George Fountain's glass plate negatives and photographic negatives depicting scenes from World War I, including battle sites in France; American, French, and German soldiers and aviators; aircraft, vehicles, and armaments; buildings, bridges, and monuments; and the aftermath of bombing raids on cities and towns. Among the images are Sargeant Alvin York standing on the hill where he faced a German machine gun battalion and General John J. Pershing at a French aviation camp. Also included are original negative sleeves with Fountain's handwritten captions, a wooden crate belonging to Fountain, and a 20th century newsclipping about glass negatives.

Glass negatives maintain order found at time of acquisition. The remaining materials are not arranged in any particular order.

b. 3	Glass negatives Images include a German hand grenade dump; an unidentified balloon camouflaged by trees; a French aviator downing a German observer near Saint-Mihiel; German trenches in the Hindenburg Line on the Western Front; and the castle at Fère-en-Tardenois, site of the Second Battle of the Marne.	1919
b. 4	Glass negatives Images include the St. Andrew quarter and cathedral of Reims after the Germans bombed the town in 1914; German prisoners captured during the Battle of Château-Thierry; and an American observer in a plane.	1919
b. 5	Glass negatives Images include steamships; Château-Thierry; General John J. Pershing and his staff reviewing a French aviation camp near Paris; and the cathedral in Reims.	1919
b. 6	Glass negatives Images include a gas mask drill; Alvin York at the site where he infiltrated German lines and faced a machine gun battalion; an observation tower near St. Mihiel; the railroad in Château-Thierry after the Germans bombed the lines; American units at Toul; trench mortars and guns; a German plane shot down by the 88 squadron at the Soissons front; and the Saumur artillery school in France.	1919

# Series II: Lantern Slides Related to Silent Film and Stereopticon, circa 1910s-1920s 3.08 linear feet (3 boxes)

This series contains hand colored lantern slides used by movie theaters to promote coming attractions and film stars, such as Marion Davies, Douglas Fairbanks, Norma Talmadge, and Will Rogers. Also included is The Great National No. 1 Stereopticon, a slide projector manufactured by the National Pictures Service of Cincinnati, Ohio.

This series contains twelve 35mm filmstrips of "Bible in Pictures," a film series created by the National Picture Company of Cincinnati, and one 35mm filmstrip related to Edward Livingston Trudeau and the Saranac Laboratory for the Study of Tuberculosis. The film canisters were formerly stored in a compartment of the stereopticon in Series II. Other materials include an unidentified fragment of a negative that may relate to silent film and a typed dinner invitation, also found in the stereopticon compartment.
