SUMMARY: This collection contains the correspondence, photographs, and personal papers of Edward Vinton Knight, Yale 1931. Of note is Knight's correspondence to his family dating from 1931-1933 when he worked in Changsha, China teaching English with the Yale-in-China Association (now the Yale-China Association). Correspondence also includes communications about Japan's hostile activities during the invasion of Manchuria in the early 1930s and later during the Second Sino-Japanese War. There is a significant amount of correspondence dating from 1937-1945 from Knight to his fiancée and later wife, Lois Hathaway Upton. Photographic materials include black and white prints of Knight and his Yale-in-China colleagues and students as well as images of the landscape, architecture, and people in China. Personal papers include Knight's miscellaneous print and manuscript materials.

Biographical / Historical

Edward Vinton Knight (1910-2004) was born in New Haven, Connecticut on April 4, 1910 to parents Reverend Franklin Knight and Gertrude Mosher Knight. Knight graduated from Holyoke High School in 1927 and graduated from Yale University in 1931. Knight spent two years in Changsha, China (Summer 1931-Summer 1933) teaching English with the Yale-in-China Association. Knight moved to Salem, Massachusetts and married Lois Hathaway Upton on June 23, 1939. Knight later taught English and Latin at the Darrow School in New Lebanon, New York. He also worked as a technical writer and later a marketing specialist for General Electric in Pittsfield, Massachusetts. Knight retired in 1975, moving to Lenox, Massachusetts and finally to Richmond, Virginia, where he died on November 13, 2004.

Scope and Contents

This collection contains the correspondence, photographs, and personal papers of Edward Vinton Knight, Yale 1931. Of note is Knight's correspondence to his family dating from 1931-1933 when he worked in Changsha, China teaching English at the Yali Union Middle School, a boys' preparatory school, with the Yale-in-China Association (now the Yale-China Association). There is correspondence from Association administrators to Knight's family regarding his travels and his bout with typhoid. Administrators also communicated about Japan's hostile activities during the invasion of Manchuria in the early 1930s and later during the Second Sino-Japanese War. Correspondence also includes a description of Knight's travels on the Trans-Siberian Railroad to Europe.

There is a significant amount of correspondence dating from 1937-1945 from Knight to his fiancée and later wife, Lois Hathaway Upton. Correspondence dating from 1937-1939 pertains to the period before Edward and Lois were married when Edward lived in Salem, Massachusetts while recovering from appendicitis and in Boston where he volunteered at Hale House and searched for work. Lois attended nursing school in Salem and Boston, graduating in November 1938. Correspondence from 1944-1945 pertains to the period when Lois and their daughter Sylvia lived with Lois's family in Salem during a difficult pregnancy with their second child, David. At the time, Edward remained in Pittsfield, Massachusetts where he worked with General Electric. Letters between the couple include information about their personal lives, relationship, and work.

Photographic materials include black and white prints of Knight and his Yale-in-China colleagues and students as well as images of the landscape, architecture, and people in China. Personal papers include material relating to Knight's travels, the Yale-in-China Association, and his miscellaneous print and manuscript materials.

Arrangement

This collection is arranged in three series: I. Correspondence, 1931-1988; II. Photographs, 1931-1951, undated; III. Personal papers, 1931-2002.

Collection Contents Series I: Correspondence, 1931–1988

This series contains correspondence written by (outgoing) and received by (incoming) Edward V. Knight. The majority of Knight's correspondence was written to his wife Lois H. Knight, née Upton. Description for correspondence was transcribed or derived from existing folder titles.

This series is arranged in two groupings as received, Outgoing and Incoming. Outgoing correspondence is arranged chronologically. Incoming correspondence is arranged alphabetically by surname.
