## Processing Information

Collections are processed to a variety of levels, depending on the work necessary to make them usable, their perceived research value, the availability of staff, competing priorities, and whether or not further accruals are expected. ## Imperial British East Africa Company

The Imperial British East Africa Company (IBEAC) was a commercial association founded to advance African trade in areas occupied by the British Empire. The company was incorporated and granted a royal charter by Queen Victoria in 1888. Led by Scottish shipping merchant Sir William Mackinnon, IBEAC administered the eastern coast of Africa from modern-day Somalia to modern-day Kenya. The company was also tasked with overseeing construction of a railway connecting the east coast region of Mombasa to Lake Victoria. IBEAC began building the Mackinnon-Sclater road, a 600-mile ox-cart track from Mombasa to Busia, Kenya, in 1890, and conducted surveys and expeditions into Uganda, but never commenced work on the railroad. The company began to fail financially, and the British government assumed administration of IBEAC's territory, which was divided to form the Uganda Protectorate in 1894 and East Africa Protectorate (later Kenya) in 1895. The Uganda Railway was completed by the government in 1901.

## Scope and Contents

The collection consists of correspondence and printed material documenting activities of the British Imperial East Africa Company (IBEAC) and its chairman, Scottish businessman William Mackinnon. Included are letterbooks, reports, pamphlets, and other materials concerning the company's early negotiations with Zanzibar respecting land, taxes, mineral rights, and other matters; general administration of IBEAC's territory; and efforts to develop a railway from Mombasa to Victoria Lake. Letters and reports additionally detail initial scouting of locations for company stations and interactions of company representatives with the Maasai people. Among the correspondents and authors are Barghash ibn Sa'id, the Sultan of Zanzibar, Captain Frederick Lugard, and IBEAC administrator George Mackenzie. The

collection additionally contains letter books documenting Mackinnon's earlier work as co-founder of the British India Steam Navigation Company and director of the City of Glasgow Bank.
