**SUMMARY:** The Dewey-Lowell Family Papers consists of correspondence, manuscripts, ephemera, photographs, notebooks, scrapbooks, and other documents created by, used, or possessed by members of the Dewey and Lowell families in New England during the 19th century. Many of the materials relate to, or are directly linked or created by notable politicians, abolitionists, writers, preachers, and businessmen from the mid to late 19th century. The collection spans the years 1779-1942, with the bulk of the material relating to the Civil War and life during the surrounding years.

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### Processing Information

Collections are processed to a variety of levels, depending on the work necessary to make them usable, their perceived research value, the availability of staff, competing priorities, and whether or not further accruals are expected. The library attempts to provide a basic level of preservation and access for all collections, and does more extensive processing of higher priority collections as time and resources permit.

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## Biographical / Historical

Born in 1794 in Sheffield, Massachusetts, Orville Dewey was a famous Unitarian preacher, who began his career in New Bedford as the Pastor of the Unitarian Church from 1823 to 1833. In 1835, he joined the ministry at the Second Unitarian Church of New York, overseeing the construction of the Church of the Messiah (following the destruction of his church due to a fire), located at 728-30 Broadway. Resigning in 1848, Dewey took time to attend to a chronic health condition, traveling to Europe for treatment as he would numerous times during his life. He picked up again with a series of lectures at the Lowell Institute in 1855. Between 1858 and 1862 he was the pastor of the New South Church in Boston, where he eventually retired to live on his home in Sheffield, dying in 1882. Among Dewey's descendants are his daughter, Mary Elizabeth Dewey (1821-1910), a noted author and translator and Charles Orville Dewey (1831-1901), a soldier with the Massachusetts 49th Infantry during the Civil War.

One of the Boston Brahmin families, the Lowell Family descended from John Lowell of Newburyport (1743-1802). With many famous descendants, the family became well known and intertwined with other literary, political, educational, and religious circles. Among some of the well-known family members are William Lowell Putnam, Mary Lowell Putnam, James Russell Lowell, Augustus Lowell, Charles Lowell, Robert Traill Spence Lowell, John Lowell, Jr., Amy Lowell, and Robert Lowell.

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## Scope and Contents

The Dewey-Lowell Family Papers consists of correspondence, manuscripts, ephemera, photographs, notebooks, scrapbooks, and other documents related to the ancestors and descendants of Orville Dewey

and the Lowell family. Alongside individual entries of daily life, the scrapbooks and notebooks include newspaper clippings, advertisements, quotes, photographs, and ephemera pasted in, as well as pressed plants. The correspondence deals largely with family matters, news, and professional and personal engagements, specifically in the years preceding, during, and following the American Civil War. The notebooks and scrapbooks are largely compiled by Mary L. Dewey and many include materials created by or related to her father, Charles Orville Dewey, and grandfather, Orville Dewey. Of particular interest are the family's relationships with famous literary and political figures of their time, including Daniel Webster, Henry Wadsworth Longfellow, Horace Greeley, Isabella Stewart Gardner, Nathaniel Hawthorne, Oliver Wendell Holmes, Ralph Waldo Emerson, Wendell Phillips, William Cullen Bryant, George Washington, Sarah Chauncey Woolsey, and William Henry Furness. Also included are deeds and land acquisition documents (dating from 1779 to 1816) related to Silas Dewey, Orville Dewey's father, loose photographs and albums documenting different generations of the Dewey family and their lives (as well as early photographic processes) and a manuscript map of *The Siege of Algiers, 1816*.

October 2023 acquisition consists of correspondence, Orville Dewey's diary dating from 1865 to 1880, a 26-page manuscript titled Oration Delivered on the 4th of July, 1811 on the 35th Year of the American Independence, clippings, an ink drawing of Dewey's home in Sheffield, Massachusetts, and a large scrapbook with documents related to family history. This addition also includes material documenting and related to marriage ceremonies performed by Orville Dewey between the years 1826 and 1833.

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## Arrangement

The Dewey-Lowell family papers are arranged into six series based on material type:

Series I. Notebooks, scrapbooks and other bound material, circa 1796-1933 Series II. Correspondence, circa 1777-1942 Series III. Manuscripts, circa 1548-1901 Series IV. Ephemera, circa 1748-1891 Series V. Deeds and related land acquisition documents, 1779-1816 Series VI. Photographs, circa 1880-1903 Series VII. October 2023 acquisition, 1812-1899

All series are arranged chronologically with the exception of Series III, Manuscripts, which is arranged by author last name. Series II, Correspondence, is divided into two sub-series based on family.

## Collection Contents

### Series I: Notebooks, scrapbooks, and other bound material, circa 1796-1933

Series I contains writings from members of both families documented in this collection. Primarily represented are writings from the Dewey family. In addition to Mary Dewey's own notebooks and journal, are scrapbooks of writings, clippings, ephemera, and other material she compiled, consisting of pasted in letter fragments, journal entries, drafts, and sermons by Orville Dewey and Charles Orville Dewey. The scrapbooks in the series also contain materials from travels in the West Indies, poetry manuscript material, and quotes from historical figures and various epitaphs.

In addition to the writings and correspondence fragments in this series, the scrapbooks include realia, ephemera, and pressed leaves, mostly compiled by Mary L. Dewey and Charles Orville Dewey. Also included are diaries and notebooks, including Charles Orville Dewey's diary from his time in the Civil War (also including pressed leaves) and Mary L. Dewey's notebooks of poems and journal entries.

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## Series II: Correspondence, circa 1777-1942

Series II contains letters (and in some cases the corresponding envelope) addressed to and from members of each family. Spanning multiple generations of Deweys and Lowells, the bulk of the letters in this series date between 1840-1900. Many of the letters concern the Civil War and life in New England during those years. Also included is correspondence from noteworthy historical figures of the time period.
