Biographical / Historical

Phillip Taylor Young (1926-2002) was a naturalized Canadian musician, teacher, and the author of books on woodwind and reed instruments and other related topics. Born in Milton, Massachusetts, Young served in World War II before studying music at Bowdoin College and Yale University (M MUS 1962). He taught at the Yale School of Music, the Taft School, and the University of Victoria.
