## Biographical / Historical

Anne Seymour Conway Damer, a sculptor and author, was born on November 8, 1749, at Coombe Bank, Sevenoaks, Kent, the only child of the military officer and politician Henry Seymour Conway (1719-1795) and his wife, Caroline Campbell Bruce, Lady Ailesbury (1721-1803). In 1767 she married the Hon. John Damer (1743-1776), but they separated seven years later. After his death she studied anatomy, modelling, and carving with the intention of becoming a sculptor; she was successful and exhibited her works at the Royal Academy over more than thirty years.

Damer was associated with British theatrical and literary circles, studied Greek and Latin, and published one novel, *Belmour* (1801). She traveled to Italy and France, including Florence and Naples, where she visited Sir William Hamilton and Paris where she presented sculptures to Napoleon. In London, Damer formed close friendships with several prominent women such as Mary Berry and Sarah Siddons. One of the greatest influences in her life and champions of her work was Horace Walpole (1717-1797) who was her guardian in her youth when her parents were abroad, and a promoter of her sculpture. Walpole made Damer his executor and bequeathed his home, Strawberry Hill in Twickenham, to her; she lived there from 1797 to 1811. Anne Seymour Damer died at her home in London on May 28, 1828.

## Collection Contents

### Series I: Letters to Damer, 1783–1823

#### 15 Folders

The letters in here are mostly single notes to Damer from a variety of friends, but there are multiple letters from some, such as the five from the Duchess of Devonshire and four from the Duke of Richmond, who wrote most often about his health. Among the interesting correspondents is Henry Richard Vassall, Baron Holland, who was sending proof pages from his edition of Horace Walpole's *Memoires of the Last Ten Years of the Reign of George the Second* (1822) that contain any mention of Damer's father Henry Seymour Conway "in case there should be any thing which you wish expunged." Also of note is Sir William Hamilton who, in his six-page letter wrote of "a chain of melancholy events" in Naples, featuring the deaths of his wife Catherine (putrid fever), Dr. Alexander Monro Drummond (a fractured skull after a fall from William Beckford's horse), and most dramatically, of the Princess Giraci Grimaldi, who was buried alive in her home in an earthquake and died of starvation.

**Series II: Letters from Damer, 1793–1828***11 Folders*

The letters here are primarily personal, but three are to businessmen: one to James Christie, and two to the coachmakers Lukin and Allan. Among the personal letters are notes to the sculptor George Bullock inviting him to visit her in Strawberry Hill, writing that she “will, with pleasure, send a ticket” when he chooses the day, and to her cousin, Francis Ingram Seymour, Marquess of Hertford, regarding her father’s papers; and a longer letter of thanks to the merchant/ancient languages scholar John Livie thanking him for getting her started with the study of Greek and reporting on her progress.
