Processing Information

Collections are processed to a variety of levels, depending on the work necessary to make them usable, their perceived research value, the availability of staff, competing priorities, and whether or not further accruals are expected. The library attempts to provide a basic level of preservation and access for all collections, and does more extensive processing of higher priority collections as time and resources permit.

Descriptions of subjects derive from identifications provided by Nettles about the subject and location of the image as well as the residence of the subject in 1970 and 2013 when applicable. Single year dates for prints derive from a memoir by Nettles collected for the Jane Kessler Memorial Archives at the Penland School of Craft in Penland, North Carolina.

Bea Nettles (born 1946)

Bea Nettles is a fine art photographer and author. She studied painting and printmaking as an undergraduate at the University of Florida and earned a master's degree in painting from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign in 1970. Nettles taught photography and artists' books from 1970-2007 at Rochester Institute of Technology, Tyler School of Art, and the University of Illinois. She creates semi-autobiographical works with themes related family relationships woven together with mythology and natural history, and often in dream-like juxtapositions.

Composite photographic portraits with hand painting by Bea Nettles that depict the subjects as Major Arcana based on the Rider-Waite Tarot published by the Rider Company in 1909 based on the instructions of academic and mystic Arthur Edward Waite (1857-1942) and illustrated by Pamela Colman Smith (1878-1951).

The Major Arcana are numbered and named cards in a divination tarot pack, and the name originally given by occultists to the trump cards of a normal tarot pack used for playing card games typically numbered from 0 to 21.

The subjects of the portraits document artists at the Penland School of Craft in Penland, North Carolina, created primarily during residencies by Nettles, as well as portraits of friends created in Rochester, New York, and portraits of family members likely created in Gainesville, Florida, and Rochester, New York.
