SUMMARY: This collection contains materials relating to George Hibbert Driver's years in Palestine and Germany in 1905-1907, studying Christian theology abroad on a Hooker Fellowship after graduating from Yale Divinity School. The collection includes extensive photographs from Palestine created, organized, dated, and described by Driver, which can be read together with correspondence Driver sent to his parents in the United States. Driver's essays, letters, photographs, and captions provide insight into an American, Christian view of Palestine, ever filtered through his religious and Orientalizing expectation.

Biographical / Historical

George Hibbert Driver was born in Lynn, Massachusetts, in 1879, and graduated from Amherst College in 1900 and 1904, and Yale Divinity School in 1905. In 1905, Driver traveled to Palestine on a Hooker Fellowship, where he studied at the American School of Oriental Study and Research. Founded in 1900 by Charles Cutler Torrey, the American School of Oriental Study and Research in Palestine was, in Driver's words, "a laboratory course in sacred geography." Located in Jerusalem, the school excavated sites across Palestine and Lebanon deemed to have biblical significance, beginning with the tombs of Sidon in 1900.

In 1905 and 1906, Driver traveled throughout Palestine, creating photographs and writing down his impressions, spiritual experiences, and comments on Ottoman rule. In April of 1906, Driver left Palestine to study at the theological faculties in Marburg and Berlin.

Upon returning to the United States in 1907, Driver began his work as a Congregational minister, serving in churches across the Northeast. He continued writing—publishing short stories, poetry, and monographs on the doctrine of the Holy Spirit. George Hibbert Driver died in Marblehead, Massachusetts, in 1966.

Scope and Contents

This collection concisely covers George Hibbert Driver's 1905-1906 trip to the American School of Oriental Study and Research in Palestine in correspondence, journalistic and diaristic essays, and photographs. Further correspondence covers Driver's time studying at the theological faculties in Marburg and Berlin. The collection provides insights into American, Christian concepts of "sacred geography" read onto late-Ottoman Palestine.

Series I, Correspondence, contains letters written by Driver addressed to his parents in the United States. The letters describe in depth his travels and studies. Further correspondence, sent to Driver, describes theological study in Germany, mentioning professors like Julius Wellhausen, and, in the correspondence from Edward H. Smith, American Christian missions in Fuzhou, China.

Series II, Writings, contains both published articles and drafts composed by Driver. In the writings, Driver provides an introduction to the American School ("Our Jerusalem Colony," "The American School for Oriental Study and Research at Home in Jerusalem"), describes his travel impressions, and comments on the politics of late-Ottoman rule ("Palestine and the Yemen Uprising"). Notably, an essay written later in 1918, "The Light on Jerusalem's Cross," addresses the British occupation of Palestine following WWI.

Series III, Collected materials, contains ephemera gathered from Driver's travels in Europe and the Middle East, writings by others and booklets, and compiled biographical info from genealogical websites.

Series IV, Photographs, is divided into two subseries. The first retains Driver's organization—the photographs are paired with negatives numerically labeled beginning with P, which according to Driver stands for "Palestine Trip." On each negative envelope, Driver describes the image, location, and impressions documented in the picture. Later numbers in the series are often dated, allowing the

researcher to collate and contextualize the photographs with correspondence in Series I. The second subseries consists primarily of reprints, some of which have descriptions written on the back.
