La Brèche (1961-1965)

La Brèche: Action surréaliste was a surrealist journal directed by André Breton and edited by Robert Benayoun, Vincent Bounoure, Gérard Legrand, José Pierre, and Jean Schuster. The publication featured writing, poetry, criticism, essays, and illustrations. It was published in Paris, France from October 1961 to November 1965, in 8 volumes. Contributors included Fernando Arrabal, Philippe Audoin, Jean-Claude Barbé, Jean-Louis Bédouin, Robert Benayoun, Jean Benoît, Micheline and Vincent Bounoure, André Breton, Jacques B. Brunius, Guy Cabanel, Jorge Camacho, Jean Carteret, Malcolm de Chazal, Charles Cros, Adrien Dax, Pierre Dhainaut, Jean-Pierre Duprey, Roland Giguère, Robert Guyon, Ragnar von Holten, Marianne Van Hirtum, Radovan Ivšic, Edouard Jaguer, Alain Joubert, Alfred Kubin, Philippe Lavergne, R. Content Description

The collection consists of printed editions and related production material for issues 1, 2, 4, and 6 of *La Brèche: Action surréaliste*, 1961-1964. It includes manuscript and typescript articles, poems, stories, photographs, collages and drawings published in issues 1, 2, 4, and 6, as well as correspondence. Authors and artists include René Alleau, Philippe Audoin, Robert Benayoun, Micheline Bounoure, André Breton, Adrien Dax, Pierre Dhainaut, Maurice de Gandillac, Julien Gracq, Jean Schuster, Jean-Claude Silbermann, and Toyen.

Of particular interest is a custom case by bookbinder Pierre Mercier that houses issues 1, 2, and 4 of *La Brèche*. Notable works in the collection include drawings by Marianne van Hirtum and Endre Roszda, a photograph by Pierre Molinier, collages by Robert Benayoun and a colorful autograph letter and envelope from Matta.

Collection Contents
