Michael Benedikt (1935-2007)

Michael Benedikt was born 26 May 1935 in New York City and educated at New York University (1956) and Columbia University (1961). From the late 1950s through 1970s, Benedikt served as an editor and held teaching and writing positions at various publications and institutions in the Northeast. He served an editor at Horizon Press (1959-1961), associate editor with *Art News* (1963-1972), poetry editor with the *Paris Review* (1974-1978), and contributing editor with the *American Poetry Review*. During this period he taught at Bennington (1968-1969), Sarah Lawrence (1969-1973), Hampshire (1973-1975), Vassar (1976-1977), and Boston University (1977-1979).

Benedikt's books of poetry include *Changes* (1961), *The Body* (1968), *Sky* (1970), *Mole Notes* (1971), *Night Cries* (1976), and *The Badminton at Great Barrington* (1980). Benedikt also authored plays, translations, and edited works on the theatre, and contributed poems, essays, and reviews to journals such as *Poetry*, *American Poetry Review*, *Iowa Review*, *Massachusetts Review*, *Agni*, *Partisan Review*, *Ploughshares*, and *Tri-Quarterly*. He died 27 February 2007.
