SUMMARY: The China Records Project Miscellaneous Personal Papers Collection is an open collection. It currently contains material from more than 325 individuals, primarily Protestant missionaries to China. The time period covered is approximately from 1834 to 1998. The China Records Project was initiated by the National Council of Churches of Christ in the U.S.A in 1968. The aim of the project was to insure the preservation of the personal records of former missionaries to China and to provide a central repository where these papers would be available to historians. The Yale Divinity School Library was chosen as this central repository in 1969 and has continued to solicit and accept China-related papers since that time.

Place names were modernized in the description, with the name originally used in the collection material or in an older version of the finding aid in parenthesis: e.g. "Beijing (Peking)" or "Benin (Dahomey)".

Existence and Location of Copies

Several sets of papers in this collection have been microfilmed and are now also available in digital format at <http://www.researchsource.amdigital.co.uk/ASChina>. The Adam Matthew digital database is accessible only to the Yale community; microfilm can be requested via interlibrary loan. Individuals whose papers are available on microfilm and digitally are noted with an asterisk.

Biographical / Historical

The China Records Project was initiated by the National Council of Churches of Christ in the U.S.A in 1968. The aim of the project was to insure the preservation of the personal records of former missionaries to China and to provide a central repository where these papers would be available to historians. The Yale Divinity School Library was chosen as this central repository in 1969 and has continued to solicit and accept China-related papers since that time.

The first Protestant missionary to China was Robert Morrison, who arrived in 1807. Elijah Coleman Bridgman was the first American missionary to China, sent by the American Board of Commissioners for Foreign Missions in 1829. Protestant missionaries were active in China until ca. 1950 when they were forced to leave by the new Communist government.

Scope and Contents

The collection consists of more than 380 boxes, with no individual accounting for more than three linear feet. Some collections that were formerly part of this record group have now been given separate record group numbers.

The papers in the first series of this collection are arranged alphabetically by name. When the information was available, each missionary's sending agency, geographical location in China and period of service have been noted. A key to abbreviations used to represent the mission sending agencies is given below. The designation "L" in the indications of period of service means that these are approximate dates derived from listings in available copies of the Directory of Protestant Missions in China (1902, 1904-05, 1908-11, 1916, 1921, 1923-24, 1926-30, 1932-36, 1940, 1950). An asterisk following the name of an individual means that at least a portion of the papers of that individual are available on microfilm (and therefore accessible via Interlibrary Loan) and through the Adam Matthew "China Through Western Eyes" database: <https://www.amscholar.amdigital.co.uk/ASChina>.

Some photographs in the collection have been digitized and are available through the Internet Mission Photography Archive (IMPA) - <https://digitallibrary.usc.edu/IMPA?TP=IMP>. If availability in IMPA is

indicated, search the IMPA database using the name of the individual, e.g., search for "Edward Abbott Papers."

The records in this collection include biographical information, correspondence, diaries and journals, writings, printed material, tape recordings, artifacts, photographs and maps. The medical, educational and evangelical work of both men and women missionaries in China is reflected in the material. Social issues such as footbinding, opium reform, education of women, cruelty to animals and child labor are also touched upon. The material is particularly valuable for the descriptions of daily missionary life and work which it provides. Missionary opinion about major social and political issues is less prevalent in the material, although personal accounts of some political events (such as the Boxer Rebellion and the internment of missionaries by the Japanese) are given.

The Oral History Transcripts of Series II are from the China Missionaries Oral History Project conducted at Claremont Graduate School in Claremont, CA in the early 1970s.

Burch, Clarence Arthur and Miriam Stuart Hewes

Biog. info: After marrying Mr. and Mrs. Burch began missionary work in China in 1906 in Wuhu. From 1906-1918, they worked under the Advent Christian Missions, and from 1918-1940 under the United Christian Mission Society. They experienced the Civil War of China (1911-1912), the Revolution (1926-1928) and the Japanese War (1936-1940). The Burches had four daughters, one of whom died tragically in her early twenties, after undergoing surgery. The Burches returned to the U.S., and Mr. Burch traveled for the UCMS. for two years. In 1942, he became an assistant professor at Texas Christian University, earning his M.A. from the university in 1947.

Dickson, Lillian R.

Lillian Ruth LeVesconte Dickson was born in Minnesota in 1901. She met her husband John Ira Dickson while attending Macalester College and married in 1927. The Dicksons were appointed to missionary service in Formosa [Taiwan] by the Canadian Presbyterian Church, arriving there in 1927. During their first thirteen years in Taiwan Lillian was missionary wife and mother while her husband taught at Tamsui Middle School and was later president of Taipai Theological School. During World War II the Dicksons left Taiwan and were reassigned to what is now British Guiana. At the end of World War II the Dicksons returned to Taiwan and Lillian became an advocate for the people of Taiwan, raising funds from donors particularly for medical work. She focused on individuals who had leprosy and their children, who normally stayed in the leper hospitals and were at high risk of contracting the disease. Dickson developed a leper colony called the Home for Untainted Babies to house the children of parents with leprosy. In 1955 Dickson's Mustard Seed, Inc. leprosarium had over 800 patients. Dickson served as a nurse and medical educator, traveling to mountain clinics. Dickson founded the interdenominational Mustard Seed International to support her missionary work, which included caring for orphans.

Lowry Family

Hiram Harrison Lowry (1843-1924) was an educator, Methodist clergyman and college president in China. A graduate of the Ohio Wesleyan University, Lowry served during the American Civil War from 1862 to 1863. In 1867 he was ordained to the ministry of the Methodist Episcopal Church and was sent out to China. On October 10, 1867, Lowry arrived with his wife, Parthenia Nicholson in Foochow [Fuzhou], where they served until 1869. In 1869 he was sent to Peking [Beijing], where he was a founder of the work of the North China Mission. In 1870 Lowry built up the first Methodist church in Northern China, the Asbury Church (today the Chongwenmen Church in Beijing), named after the American Methodist Bishop Francis Asbury. From 1873 to 1893, Lowry served as superintendent of North China Mission, and from 1914 as president of Huiwen University, which became part of Yenching University. Lowry retired in 1922 and died in Peking [Beijing]. Lowry's sons George Nicholson Lowry and E. K. Lowry were also Methodist missionaries in Peking [Beijing]. George was a medical missionary, husband of Cora Calhoun. E.K. Lowry's wife was Katharine Mullikin Lowry.

McFadyen, Archibald

McFadyen (1877-1946) was a medical missionary serving under the Southern Presbyterian Mission from 1904 to 1942 in Lianyungang (Hsuehchowfu/Haichow) and Xuzhou (Suchowfu/Suchow), Jiangsu (Kiangsu) province. McFadyen's first wife, Catherine, died in 1914. His second wife, Helen, was a nurse at the mission hospital in Xuzhou (Suchowfu).

Letters from Archibald McFadyen to family members in North Carolina describe his work as a medical missionary serving under the Southern Presbyterian Mission from 1904 to 1942. Also included are letters addressed from his first wife Catherine and his second wife, Helen. The original accession also contains two folders of correspondence of others, including daughter Sarah McFadyen and cousin Flora Boyce, who was a missionary teacher. In the 2023 accession, two photographic albums, one compiled by Flora McNeill Boyce and one inscribed most likely by his son John McFadyen, depict the McFadyen homes in Suzhou and Guling (Kuling), China, as well as the Shanghai American School, where the McFadyen children attended. The albums contain photographs of the McFadyen family in both China and North Carolina, as well as scenes from community gatherings of missionaries.

1855–1923

This collection consists of Mateer and Henderson family biographical information, correspondence, photographs, and collected materials. John Lowrie Mateer, born in Adams County, Pennsylvania on April 16, 1848, and Mrs. Mary (La Rhue Sellers) Mateer, born in St. Thomas, Franklin Co., Pennsylvania on March 29, 1845, were Presbyterian missionaries in China. J.L. Mateer was put in charge of the Presbyterian Mission Press in Shanghai, China in 1871. He returned to the U.S. under ill health in 1876 and went back to North China in 1894 to run the North China Mission. He died on April 23, 1900 in Beijing ("Peking"), China. Mary Mateer worked for several years in China under the Presbyterian Woman Board before returning to the U.S. to engage in rescue work for Chinese women. In 1894, she traveled back to Beijing with J.L. Mateer, before returning to the U.S. following his death in 1900.

The correspondence in this collection dates from 1855 to 1923 and includes letters between J.L. Mateer, Mary Mateer and their children, specifically Jennie (Mateer) Henderson/Kirkwood, regarding the Presbyterian Mission in China, as well as life in the United States. In addition, correspondence includes various letters between members of the Mateer and Henderson families. The collection includes various undated correspondence, miscellaneous photographs, and collected materials.

<p>Series V: Riggs, Grace</p> <p>Grace (Frederick) Riggs (1893-1984) was the wife of an agricultural missionary Charles H. Riggs, who served various Chinese missions between 1916-1951. Grace met Charles while they were both studying at the Bible Teachers' Training School (BTTS) during fall 1914. Grace and Charles married on August 31, 1916. When Charles was offered a position in Shaowu, China as manager for an Agricultural Experiment Farm, they left for China together on September 7, 1916. Following a year of language school in Nanjing, Grace and Charles traveled to Shaowu, Fujian province where Charles began his work as Agricultural Manager. Grace spent her time raising her children with the help of their hired staff. She also tutored her children in their early studies, held a retreat for Christian women in her home, and helped with the Mission Women's sewing projects. Beginning in 1917, Grace gave birth to seven children: Frederick, Wilbert and Robert (twins, stillborn), Charles Jr., Elisabeth (Betsy), Wendell, and Edith, their youngest born in Shaowu in 1929. In 1923, the family returned to the U.S. on furlough, allowing both Grace and Charles to complete their studies and graduate from BTTS. They returned to Shaowu in 1924, this time with Charles' father, who died a year later. In 1930, they returned to the U.S. again. Charles continued his studies at Union Theological Seminary, and Grace helped him with the typing of his thesis. In 1931, while the family was still in New York, the Shaowu mission was closed. They returned to China in 1932 after Charles was offered a position at the University of Nanking. In Nanjing, Grace taught English to Chinese students in the morning, all of whom were boys in their first year of junior high school. In the afternoons and evenings, she taught at a Bible school. With the beginning of the Japanese War in 1937, the family returned to the U.S. without Charles. In 1946, Charles joined the UNRRA in Shanghai. Grace then traveled to Shanghai, and they stayed there until their final return to the U.S. in 1951.</p> <p>Upon the death of Grace's mother in 1948, her husband emptied the house to be sold and burned all paper items, including letters Grace sent home to her mother from China between 1916-1948, in a backyard bonfire. The letters that remained included those Grace sent to her son Fred who had returned to the U.S. in 1935 to attend university, and letters to her youngest daughter Edith, her sister Marion, and other family members. The correspondence included in this collection begins with a single letter written by Grace addressed to "friends" in 1919, followed by letters that were not burned in 1948, written between 1935-1951. Shepherd, Clara Sargent and George W.

Clara Sargent went to China in 1919 as the first female doctor to serve in the field of public health. She worked with the National Council on Health Education and served on the faculty of the Women's College of Physical Education in Shanghai, which later became a department of Ginling College in Nanking. She promoted public health campaigns in China and helped in writing health textbooks for Chinese government schools. In 1921, she married the Rev. Dr. George Shepherd, and served as a physician and public health director under the American Board of Commissioners for Foreign Missions (ABCFM) in Shaowu and Fuzhou (Foochow) in Fujian (Fukien). She and Rev. Shepherd were evacuated from China shortly before Pearl Harbor.

Yueyang (Yochow City) was taken over by the Kuomintang in August 1926. In November, the workers at the mission went on strike and students began making demands. In late 1926, educational work was discontinued at the mission and, in January of 1927, the nurses training school at Hoy was forced to close and women and children were evacuated. John Calvin Stucki was held captive by the Nationalists until February when he was permitted to join his wife and return to the United States.

Syle, Edward W.

British-born Edward W. Syle (1817-1890) served as an Episcopal missionary to China and the Chinese in the United States. He arrived in China with the Protestant Episcopal Church Mission as early as 1845. Fleeing the Taiping Rebellion in 1853, Syle next served as Episcopal missionary to the Chinese population in San Francisco in 1855. He spent less than two years in California before returning to China, where he was based in Shanghai. He later served in Japan and then Philadelphia and New York in the 1880s before retiring to London where he died in 1890.

Tucker, Augustine W. (family)

Augustine Washington Tucker (1883-1958) was an Episcopal medical missionary in Shanghai for more than forty years. His wife, Annie Webb Cheshire (1884-1964), began her missionary service in China in 1909. They were married in 1914 and had seven children: Augustine, Annie, Maria, Joseph, Elizabeth, Sarah, and Beverley. A.W. Tucker's brother Ellis was a professor at St. John's University in Shanghai. His brother Henry St. George Tucker was a missionary in Japan and later Presiding Bishop of the Episcopal Church in the United States of America.

This collection consists of correspondence of Augustine and Annie Tucker to/from their daughter Elizabeth Toole Tucker (Eddy) as well as other correspondence and memorabilia of Elizabeth, correspondence of her brother Beverley, writings, genealogical and biographical material about the Tucker family, photographs, and collected material.

Ward Family

Included here are materials related to various members of the Ward and Worley families, contributed by the family of Beulah Albright Johnson, who was a childhood friend of Mildred Morley Ward. Beulah and Mildred met when Mildred's family was in the U.S. for furlough and they corresponded with each other from 1894 until Mildred's death in 1947. Beulah and her daughter Marian kept in touch with the Worley-Ward family through their lives.

Mildred May Worley was born in Kiukiang [now Jiujiang] in 1883, the daughter of Methodist missionaries Rev. and Mrs. J. H. Worley, and grew up in China. In 1905 Mildred married Ralph Ansel Ward. She died in Jiujiang in 1947. Ralph Ward was born in 1882 in Ohio. He served as a Methodist missionary in Foochow [now Fuzhou] from 1909 to 1916 and thereafter in various administrative roles for the Methodist Episcopal Church in China. He was President of the Anglo-Chinese College, Fuzhou, 1925-1927. He was appointed as a Bishop of the Methodist Episcopal Church in China in 1937. He was interned during the war years 1941 to 1946. After Mildred's death, Ralph married Katherine Boeye. He died in 1958. Mildred and Ralph Ward had two daughters, Imogene and Gladys ("Pete"). Imogene married Douglas Sargent and they were missionaries in China. Gladys married Thomas Lyles.

These papers were donated by the grandchildren of Beulah Albright Johnson, a childhood friend of Mildred Worley Ward. Beulah was the daughter of George Albright and Almira Jane Acker Albright. She married Clarence Johnson and they had two children, Wayne and Marian (1917-2001), who married Kenneth Darling in 1942 and had four children: Alan, Wayne, Ann, and Stephen.

Mildred Worley and Beulah Albright became friends at age 7 in 1890, when Mildred's family was in the U.S. They remained lifelong friends and their children continued to correspond with each other after the deaths of Mildred and Beulah. Written in a tumultuous time from China, the letters of Mildred and Ralph Ward, and their children Imogene (and her husband Douglas Sargent), and Gladys include many details about political events and their impact on the missionaries.
