SUMMARY: Chiefly correspondence, memoranda, a notebook, and memorabilia relating to Vanderbilt's service as an officer in the U.S. Engineers during World War I. Also included are technical notebooks on mathematics, chemistry, and engineering (1897-1926). Of particular note are two illustrated manuscript volumes: one by Joseph Lyddell Peyton outlining a course of instruction for British naval officers, and the second by John Burnell showing the headlands of various coastlines in Europe and Africa. Also in the papers are checkbooks, guestbooks, a nurse's record of Vanderbilt's case of typhoid fever (1902-1903), and inventories of the Vanderbilt library in New York City, and of his yacht.

Biographical / Historical

Cornelius Vanderbilt: capitalist; A.B., Yale, 1895, Ph.B., 1898, M.E., 1899; officer in the U.S. Engineers, 1917-1918.

Scope and Contents

This collection contains a miscellany of papers relating to Cornelius Vanderbilt III. There is a small amount of general correspondence dealing mainly with business matters, and a larger selection of military correspondence, memoranda, and a notebook, all stemming from Vanderbilt's service as an officer in the U.S. Engineers during World War I. There are in addition a few items of memorabilia, two inventories, and five photographic copies of commissions issued by the U.S. Continental Congress and other Revolutionary-era bodies.

The remainder of the papers consists of bound volumes, the most interesting of which are two lavishly illustrated manuscripts: *A Plan Executed At the Royal Naval Academy*, by Joseph Lyddell Peyton (1803); and *Martimagraphy or A Discription [sic] of the Sea Coast*, by John Burnell (n.d.). The first provides a complete course of instruction for British Naval Officers, while the second contains drawings of headlands of various coastlines. The other volumes in the papers include a nurse's report of Vanderbilt's bout of typhoid in 1902-1903, twenty-three notebooks on topics such as engineering, mathematics, and chemistry, six checkbooks, an engagement book, and four guestbooks.

These papers were donated to Yale University by Mrs. Vanderbilt and the Vanderbilt estate in 1944-1945, and by Donald Wing in 1968.
