Biographical / Historical

Erik Axel Waller was born on November 29, 1875 at Unum, Sweden. He received his medical degree in 1900 from the University of Uppsala where he later taught anatomy and physiology. He also studied with John Berg at the Karolinska Institut, Stockholm.

From 1909 to his retirement in 1933, Waller was physician and surgeon-in-chief at Lidköping. He was the Librarian of the Swedish Medical Library Association in Stockholm from 1940 until his return to Lidköping in 1951.

Waller began collecting medical books in 1910 and by 1950 had amassed an outstanding collection of more than 23,000 volumes, which included not only early surgical texts, but herbals, many incunabula, and literary writings by and about physicians. John Fulton called Waller "the collector of the greatest personal library on the History of Medicine in existence." Waller gave his collection to the University of Uppsala which published a complete catalogue of his library, *Bibliotheca Walleriana*. He died in Lidköping on January 30, 1955.

Scope and Contents

The Erik Waller Collection documents the bibliophilic enthusiasms that Waller shared with Harvey Cushing and John Fulton. The collection includes Erik Waller's original letters to Cushing and Fulton and carbon copies of their replies (folders 5-8) These letters document their mutual interest in collecting and the exchange of gifts of significant medical historical books. They also record Cushing's and Fulton's efforts to help Waller recover the 1628 copy of William Harvey's *De motu cordis*, which had been stolen from him. In addition, the collection contains descriptions of Waller's library, the *Bibliotheca Walleriana*, and correspondence about the development of its catalogue. There are also a few photographs, mainly of Waller, his family, and associates.
