Biographical / Historical

James Bryce, Viscount Bryce, was born in Belfast in 1838. He studied at Oxford and was called to the bar in 1867. From 1870 to 1893 he was Regius Professor of Civil Law at Oxford. Bryce served in the House of Commons from 1880 until 1906 and was a member of three Cabinets. He was ambassador to the United States from 1907 to 1913. He was created Viscount Bryce in 1914 and served in the House of Lords until his death in 1922. Bryce authored several works on law, history, travel, and foreign policy.

Scope and Contents

The papers consist of signed manuscripts for the second and third articles of James Bryce's "Impressions of South Africa," which appeared in the *Century Illustrated Monthly Magazine* in 1896.
