Scope and Contents

The Benjamin Pearson Family Papers consist of family letters, poetry, and other writings, 1726-1818, by and about the Pearson family of England and Pennsylvania. Most of the letters are addressed to Benjamin Pearson (1682-1763) from various locations in England. Pearson had emigrated from Yorkshire in 1712 and had settled with his wife and children in Darby, Pennsylvania. Correspondents include his brother, Laurence Pearson; his sister, Margaret (Pearson) Jeffreys; his cousin, Samuel Ashton; his nephew and niece Michael and Patience (Jeffreys) Bland; and Elizabeth, John, and Thomas Bears. The correspondents all were members of the Society of Friends, and the letters record their attitudes toward religion, work, family life, society, and historical events. A notebook of poetry, compiled and annotated by Pearson's sons and later descendants, is one of the few items in the papers produced by the American branch of the family.

Mrs. H. J. Knowles donated the papers to Yale Library in 1954. They were transferred from the Miscellaneous Manuscripts Collection (MS 352) in 1985.
