Biographical / Historical

Charles Maurice Fleischner, 1901-

Charles Maurice Fleischner was born in West Somerville, Massachusetts, on June 12, 1901 and graduated from Yale College in 1923. In the 1930s he worked with the Yale University Press and *The Yale Review* and studied art history and classical Chinese as a graduate student at Yale. He received his M.A. degree in 1940.

During World War II Fleischner served in the United States Navy. Following the war he went to Berlin as deputy chief of the Monuments, Fine Arts, and Archives Section of the Office of the Military Government for Germany (U.S.). His work involved the restitution of paintings, sculpture, and other works of art to their country of origin.

Scope and Contents

The Charles Maurice Fleischner Papers consist of correspondence, reports, writings, and printed material which document Charles Fleischner's friendship with Henri and Marguerite Focillon and his work as deputy chief of the Monuments, Fine Arts, and Archives Section of the Office of the Military Government for Germany (U.S.). Included in the correspondence of the Monuments, Fine Arts, and Archives Section are exchanges with Louis Bancel LaFarge and Lamont Moore.

Fleischner donated his papers to the Yale University Library between 1986 and 1988.
