## Biographical / Historical

Henry B. White was born in New York City on July 23, 1906. He was a graduate of Columbia University and was a World War II veteran, serving with the 9th Photo Reconnaissance Squadron in India and Burma. White taught at the Foote School in New Haven from 1941 to 1952. He then worked for S. Curtis & Sons in Newtown, Connecticut. From 1971 to 1978, White served as a printer for the Sterling Memorial Library, Yale University. He died in Hamden, Connecticut on May 31, 1992.

## Scope and Contents

The Henry B. White Papers consist of correspondence from Henry B. White to his wife, Dorothy Welch White. The letters detail White's military experiences from 1943 to 1945, covering such topics as his basic training in the United States and subsequent postings in Morocco, Northern Africa, India, and Burma. The letters contain detailed descriptions of military training and camp life, the flora and fauna of Africa and India, and Sikh and Hindu rituals.

The papers also include correspondence from Colonel George M. Welch to his daughter, Dorothy Welch White, written while he was stationed in the Southwest Pacific area in 1943.
