The entire collection, with the exception of Accession 2013-M-023, is available on microfilm and may be purchased from Gale Group, Farmington Hills, Michigan.

Scope and Contents

The collection contains correspondence; government documents; published illustrated materials; and writings from the Southern Cone region of Latin America (Argentina, Paraguay, Uruguay). The collection is arranged by country, and by date within country. The description of each item includes, when possible, its author, title, place of origin, and a summary of its contents. When an item is a copy of an original, it is arranged by the date of the original. The date field, however, contains the date of the copy itself, not the original. The date of the original is included in the summary description of the item.

Arrangement

The collection is arranged alphabetically by country, and by date within country.

Collection Contents

Inventory, 1779-1988

The collection is comprised of originals and copies of materials from Argentina, Paraguay and Uruguay. The majority pertain to Argentinian history from the late eighteenth century to the middle of the present century. Of particular significance is a nineteenth century bound volume bearing the imprint "De Don Jose San Martin." It contains numerous handwritten passages drawn from philosophical texts, religious and political treatises, as well as literary works, which reflect the education and thinking of this leader of South American independence. A summary of documents dealing with the abortive Alzaga rebellion, written by the acting Viceroy, discusses the political situation in Argentina just prior to independence. Materials about Buenos Aires's La Boca neighborhood are useful for the study of Italian immigration to Argentina, and the history of the Argentine-Italian community. Of note regarding Paraguay are handwritten copies of several little-known texts that deal with the country's history in the early nineteenth century.

Patrons must use microfilm on FILM HM 251 instead of the originals.

Accession 2015-M-051: Additional material, 1975-1995

This accession consists of late twentieth-century imprints on various trade unions in Argentina. The bulk of the materials comes from the period between 1980 and 1995. It includes materials on Asociación de Trabajadores del Estado (ATE), Federación Argentina de Trabajadores de Luz y Fuerza (FATLYF), Federación Obreros y Empleados Telefónicos de la República Argentina (FOETRA), Sindicato de Mecánicos y Afines del Transporte Automotor de la República Argentina (SMATA), Union of State Oil Workers (SUPE), and teachers' unions. Materials consist of directories, contracts, labor agreements, salary agreements, retirement issues, press releases, and other official union documents.
