Biographical / Historical

John Calmann (né Hans Rudolf Calmann), was born in Hamburg, Germany, on December 6, 1935. The son of a Jewish father, he emigrated with his family to England in March 1937, first to Horspath and later to London. Calmann was educated at the village school at Horspath, the Dragon School in Oxford, Arnold House School in London, Westminster School, and at Christ Church, University of Oxford. He took his degree in history in 1957 and then studied for a B.Litt. degree at St. Anthony's College, but did not receive it. From 1959 to 1960 John Calmann lived in New York under Benjamin Sonnenberg's (his mentor) aegis and worked as a journalist for *The Wall Street Journal*. During this time he wrote many of the letters published in the book *The Letters of John Calmann, 1951-1980*. He then returned to his parents' home, Perridge House in Pilton, where he completed a novel in 1961. From 1962 to 1963 he worked in Luxembourg as an international civil servant. Back in England, he edited *The Times* supplement *Opera Mundi* — Europe from 1963 to 1965. From 1965 to 1966 he worked for the Institute for Strategic Studies and wrote *A Handbook of Western Europe*. In 1967 he joined the publishing house of Paul Elek, and he became a candidate for the Liberal Party for the Hampstead section of London. In 1969 he joined the Phaidon Press. In 1975 he established his own co-edition publishing firm, Blacker, Calmann & Cooper (later John Calmann & Cooper, John Calmann & King and Calmann & King). On April 26, 1980, Calmann was murdered by a hitchhiker near Bollène, France.

Scope and Contents

The papers consist of writings, correspondence, and diaries documenting John Calmann's career and life as a gay man in Britain at a time of changing attitudes towards homosexuality.

Arrangement

The material is arranged in two series and one addition: Series 1. Writings, 1945-1973; Series II. Personal and Correspondence, 1943-1987.

Collection Contents

Series I: Writings, 1945-1973

The series is arranged alphabetically and includes articles, book reviews, editorials, essays, plays, novels, and poetry. It is likely that some of the writings are unpublished.
