## **Biographical / Historical**

David J. Edwards was pastor of the American and English Union Church in Leipzig from at least 1888 until 1896, when he left due to a dispute with some members of his church. He spent a short time preaching in Brussels, after which he returned to the U.S., preaching between bouts of ill-health he preached in various places including Peace Dale, Rhode Island, between 1897 and 1898, Clifton Springs, New Jersey, in 1902, and Margaretville, New York, in 1904. He appears to have resided in New Haven, Connecticut, during this period and also to have worked for the Y.M.C.A. from time to time.

#### Scope and Contents

David J. Edwards' papers consist of correspondence; of sermons preached in Germany, Brussels, and the United States; of notes on religious topics and notes for a lecture on Egypt; of four unidentified photographs; and of miscellaneous poems, newspaper clippings, and memorabilia. In Edwards' correspondence is a copy of a letter from him to the American Consul in Leipzig asserting his innocence of unspecified charges of dishonesty which resulted in his departure from Leipzig and protesting the confiscation of his property (1896 Jan 5). Many of the letters written to Edwards in the following few years offer consolation in the face of adversity and support from his friends. The remaining letters are largely from friends in Germany, Brussels, and the United States, and are for the most part concerned with church matters and the personal affairs of the writers. Among these is one letter from a doctor in Tientsin, China, writing of his life there (1891 Feb 28) and a series of letters from a friend describing the social and cultural life of Brussels (1897-1898). A number of letters are in French and German.

The provenance of these papers is unknown.
