Conditions Governing Use

The Matilda Tyler Collection of Rudyard Kipling is the physical property of the Beinecke Rare Book and Manuscript Library. Literary rights, including copyright, belong to the authors or their legal heirs and assigns. For further information, consult the appropriate curator.

Processing Information

Collections are processed to a variety of levels, depending on the work necessary to make them usable, their perceived research value, the availability of staff, competing priorities, and whether or not further accruals are expected. The library attempts to provide a basic level of preservation and access for all collections, and does more extensive processing of higher priority collections as time and resources permit.

This collection received a basic level of processing, including rehousing and minimal organization. Various acquisitions associated with the collection have not been merged and organized as a whole. Each acquisition is described separately in the contents list, titled according to month and year of acquisition.

Information included in the Description of Papers note and Collection Contents section is drawn from information supplied with the collection and from an initial survey of the contents. Folder titles appearing in the contents list are often based on those provided by the creator or previous custodian. Titles have not been verified against the contents of the folders in all cases. Otherwise, folder titles are supplied by staff during initial processing.

Matilda Tyler (1916-1992)

Matilda Tyler (1916-1992), a descendant of John James Audubon, attended Bryn Mawr, graduated from Barnard College and worked as a teacher at Wallingford High School, in Wallingford, Connecticut, from 1956 until 1979. Tyler was a lifelong collector of Kipling-related books, ephemera, and manuscripts, amassing more than two thousand printed volumes that included pirated and popular editions and many association copies. She was an active member of the Kipling Society.

Scope and Contents

Manuscripts, correspondence, printed material, and memorabilia by Rudyard Kipling, as well as material about Kipling, collected by Matilda Tyler. Kipling materials include 33 letters from Kipling to Thacker, Spink and Company, as well as letters to Samuel Clemens and William Ernest Henley; manuscripts of "Follow Me 'Ome" and "A Hole in the Lake;" photographs of Kipling; and the red clay model of the insignia used on many editions of Kipling. Other material includes bookseller correspondence, clippings, and auction catalogs documenting Matilda Tyler's collecting activities.
