SUMMARY: The collection consists of material relating to F. S. Joelson and his work as editor of the weekly newspaper, East Africa and Rhodesia, and as author of works on East Africa and colonialism. Material includes typescripts of works by or believed to be by Joelson; correspondence and printed material relating to the publication of Joelson's book Germany's Claim to the Colonies (1939); scrapbooks of clippings from the "Who's Who" column of East Africa; scrapbooks of clippings from other East African newspapers; and front page clippings of East Africa and East Africa and Rhodesia. Also included are originals and reproductions of caricatures and cartoons by Ralph Sallon and others. The collection provides insight into British perspectives on Africa during the colonial period of the early- and mid-twentieth century, and documents - in the form of caricature - many of the key figures of the British colony in East Africa prior to the Second World War.

Processing Information

Collections are processed to a variety of levels, depending on the work necessary to make them usable, their perceived research value, the availability of staff, and competing priorities. The library attempts to provide a basic level of preservation and access for all collections as they are acquired, and does more extensive processing of higher priority collections as time and resources permit.

This collection received a medium level of processing shortly after receipt by the library in 2008-2009. Processing included rehousing all material in acid-free folders and boxes (original caricatures and reproductions were already individually sleeved), and organization into series based on activity or format.

Information included in the Description of Papers and Collection Contents is drawn from information supplied with the collection and from a brief survey of the contents. Folder titles are supplied by staff.

F. S. (Ferdinand Stephen) Joelson (1893-1979)

F. S. Joelson was a writer on African affairs and the founder and editor of the weekly newspaper *East Africa and Rhodesia*, which ran from 1924 to 1967 and was known as *East Africa* from 1924 to 1938. His published books include: *The Tanganyika Territory (formerly German East Africa): Characteristics and Potentialities* (1920), *Eastern Africa Today and Tomorrow* (1934), and *Germany's Claims to the Colonies* (1939).

Scope and Contents

The collection consists of material relating to F. S. Joelson and his work as editor of the weekly newspaper, *East Africa and Rhodesia*, and as author of works on East Africa and colonialism. Material includes typescripts of works by or believed to be by Joelson; correspondence and printed material relating to the publication of Joelson's book *Germany's Claim to the Colonies* (1939); scrapbooks of clippings from the "Who's Who" column of *East Africa*; scrapbooks of clippings from other East African newspapers; and front page clippings of *East Africa* and *East Africa and Rhodesia*. Also included are originals and

This series contains original caricatures in pen and ink by Ralph Sallon drawn for the *East Africa* weekly newspaper with handwritten identifications on the verso, as well as two cartoons by Sallon, three pen and ink and watercolor caricatures by Ernest Scott, and one pen and ink cartoon by L. A. Stronach. Also found are reproductions of caricatures by Sallon, which are unidentified and unsorted and some of which duplicate the originals.

Original caricatures by Sallon are arranged alphabetically by surname of individual depicted. Cartoons and works by other artists and reproductions of caricatures by Sallon are arranged in files at the end.
