Processing Information

The Robert Louis Stevenson collection contains material by and related to Stevenson acquired by the library through various gifts and purchases from 1947 to 2004. This material was previously shelved with the Edwin J. Beinecke Collection of Robert Louis Stevenson, in some cases interfiled, and known informally as the library's "Stevenson collection." During reprocessing of the "Stevenson collection" in 2009, material was identified and separated by provenance so that all Stevenson and Stevenson-related material acquired by Edwin J. Beinecke resides in the Edwin J. Beinecke Collection of Robert Louis Stevenson (GEN MSS 664) and all Stevenson and Stevenson-related material acquired through other sources resides in the Robert Louis Stevenson Collection (GEN MSS 684).

This collection includes material formerly classed as Uncat Ms Vault 110, Uncat Ms Vault 240, Uncat Ms Vault 241, Uncat Ms Vault 370, Uncat Ms Vault 388, Uncat Ms Vault 406, Uncat Ms Vault 423, Uncat Ms Vault 644, Uncat Ms Vault 649, Uncat Ms Vault 693, Uncat Ms Vault 698, Uncat Ms Vault 721, Uncat Ms Vault 722, Uncat Ms Vault 734, Uncat Ms Vault 735, Uncat Mss 105, Uncat Mss 236, and Uncat Mss 512. The collection also includes material formerly classed as Uncat Ms Vault File Stevenson and Ms Vault Stevenson Supplemental, the bulk of which is in the Edwin J. Beinecke Collection of Robert Louis Stevenson (GEN MSS 664), as well as several items (McKay numbers 474, 2622, 6062, 6106a, 7580, and 8404) described in George Leslie McKay's *A Stevenson Library: Catalogue of a Collection of Writings by and about Robert Louis Stevenson*.

Robert Louis Stevenson (1850-1894)

Robert Louis Stevenson was one of the most popular and prolific British writers of the late 19th century, the author of verse, novels, travel books, short stories, plays, and essays, including such titles as *The Strange Case of Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde* and *Treasure Island*. There is considerable secondary literature on Stevenson, including book-length biographical studies, chronologies, and bibliographies. Summary information is available in the standard print and online biographical resources.

Scope and Contents

The Robert Louis Stevenson Collection consists of correspondence, manuscript notes and drafts, photographs, original artwork, printed ephemera, memorabilia, and other material relating to Robert Louis Stevenson acquired by the library through various gifts and purchases from 1947 to 2004. The collection spans the years 1765 to 1983, with the bulk dating from 1852 to 1931.

The collection is housed in 22 boxes and arranged by provenance. The collection includes named gifts and purchases from Major General and Mrs. John Ramsey Pugh, Justin G. Turner, Charles Scribner's Sons, Francis Woolsey Bronson, Christie's New York and the Alta California Bookstore, as well as smaller gifts and purchases from other sources. Boxes 14-21 and 22 contain Oversize and Restricted Fragile material respectively.

The Correspondence in Series I consists of letters from Robert Louis Stevenson to others, mostly family, arranged alphabetically by recipient. Writings consists of work by Stevenson and features notes and autograph drafts for numerous poems, stories, essays, and other works. Other Material consists of items about or relating to Stevenson, including third-party letters, biographical notes, and photographs.

The Pugh gift includes inventories for two 1963 donations, with item descriptions, and most letters and manuscripts include transcriptions and vendor or auction folders, which provide provenance information on previous ownership and dates of purchase (1914-1915).

Series II: Justin G. Turner Gift, 1765-1923*0.84 linear feet (2 boxes)*

Series II, Justin G. Turner Gift, consists of photographs of Robert Louis Stevenson and his parents and other material about and relating to Stevenson. Photographs include an album containing twelve photographs of Stevenson from his infancy to his call to the Scottish bar, circa 1875, and six daguerreotypes. Other Material includes manuscript and printed material about Stevenson and memorabilia, such as a lock of hair and a wooden chest.

Series IV, the F. W. (Francis Woolsey) Bronson gift consists of material relating to Bronson's research into Robert Louis Stevenson's ballad the "Dead Man's Chest" (found in *Treasure Island*). The research files preserve Bronson's arrangement of numerically ordered groups of material relating to works, and include correspondence, clippings, printed works, and notes. Correspondence includes letters to Bronson from Young Ewing Allison, Ernest McNeill Eller, Lord Frederic Hamilton, John Ernest Levo, Michael Monahan, Vincent Starrett, Burton Egbert Stevenson, and others, as well as bookdealers, editors, and publishers.

Series VII: Material From Other Sources, 1867-1977*2.5 linear feet (6 boxes)*

Series VII, Material From Other Sources, consists of single items and small groups of material acquired by gift or purchase from sources other than those identified in Series I through Series VI. Correspondence consists of letters from Robert Louis Stevenson and third-party letters. Writings includes numerous corrected manuscript drafts by Stevenson and scripts and scores for theatrical adaptations of Stevenson's *Treasure Island*. Artwork and Objects include a plaster representation of Stevenson by Henry Gamley, an album of thirty-one drawings by French artist Jean Hugo for a limited edition of *An Inland Voyage* (Stamford, CT: Overbrook Press, 1938), as well as a chair owned by Stevenson. Other Material, which includes a Stevenson passport and royalty statements, consists chiefly of printed materials relating to Stevenson.
